The Farmers Association of Coal Creek Township met at the school house in their regular meeting it being in the busiest part of corn husking there was a small attendance.

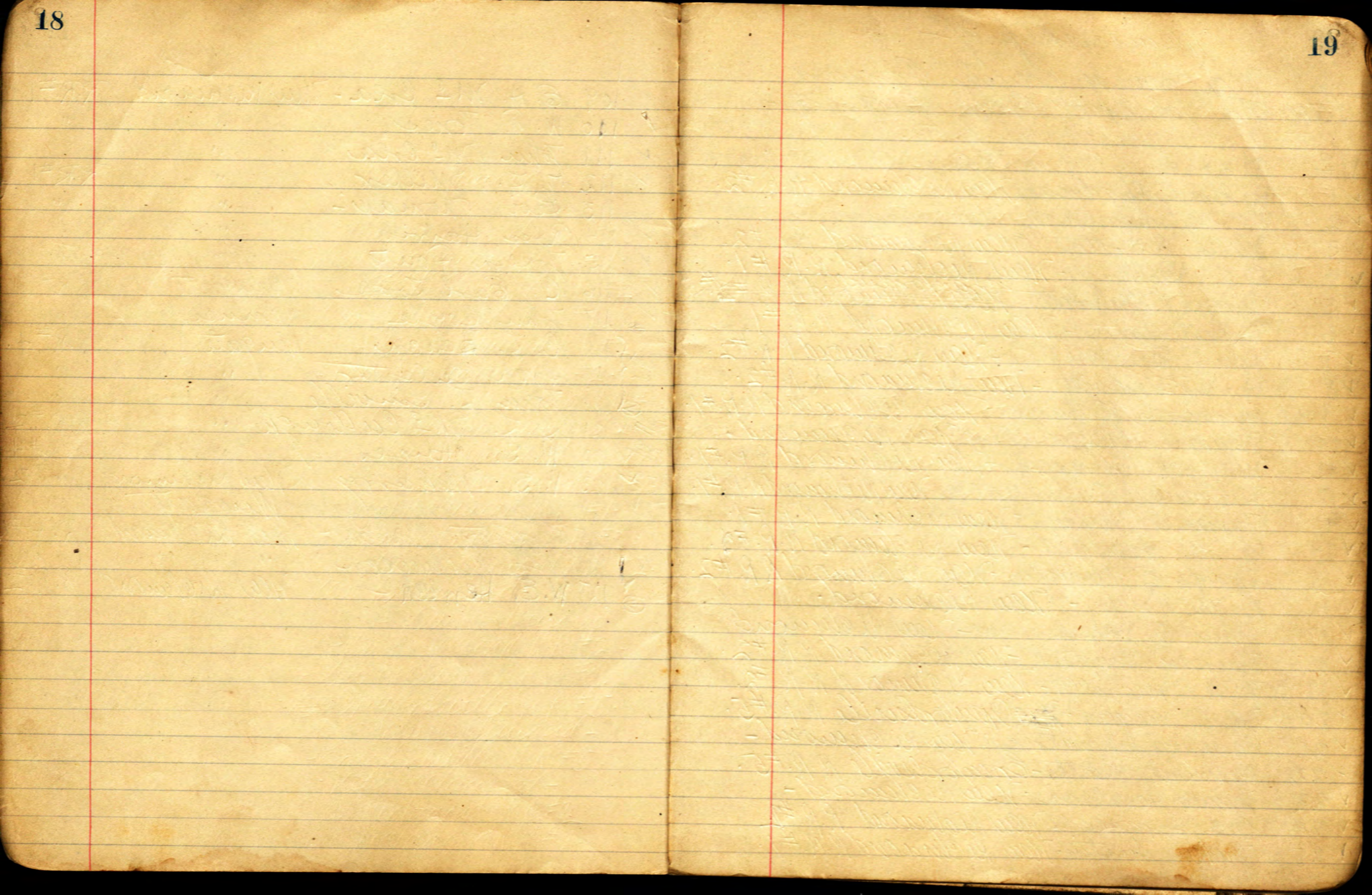
