**CIVIL WAR VETERAN
BENJAMIN HALL IS
DEAD AT HOME HERE**

His death was reported in this city
following an illness.

Benjamin P. Hall, 87 years of age,
former Civil War veteran, residing at 12
North 1st St. in this city, died
yesterday, following an illness of several
weeks. He had been in the hospital
for some time and was suffering from
the effects of old age and general
