Pursuant to ~~an~~ donation by Mrs Gro. H Long of eight thousand \$8000<sup>00</sup> dollars for the building of a New Christian Church in New Richmond, the congregation to raise an equal amount, there was a call meeting of the members on the above date.

The purpose of this meeting was to select committees and ~~discuss~~ discuss plans for raising the additional money. Bro W. D. Lauer was chosen as Chairman.

On Motion of Bro C. C. Giggis seconded by Bro Joseph Young, Bros. W. D. Lauer, A. D. Long & Raymond Whipple, were chosen to select a building Committee. The following members being chosen.

Bro C. A. Patton was chosen on this Committee but declined to serve.

It was suggested that Bro C. W. Coulter be second to assist the Building Committee in their outline of the work. Bro Giggis being chosen to see him personally and arrange for him to meet with the Committee. Meeting adjourned.

BE IT RESOLVED: By the Trustees of the Christian Church of New Richmond, Indiana, that the president and secretary of said Trustees, together with the other members of said Trustees, be, and they are hereby, authorized to borrow the sum of \$10000.00, and to execute the notes of the Trustees of the Christian Church of New Richmond evidencing said loan, and to secure the repayment thereof by mortgage or mortgages on any and all real estate owned by the Trustees of the Christian Church of New Richmond, said note or notes, and mortgage or mortgages, to be upon such terms and conditions and payable at such times and in such manner, as may be determined by the President and Secretary of said Trustees, and their execution of such notes and mortgages shall be deemed conclusive evidence of their determination of such questions.

The Building Com. of the Christian Church met at the home of O. W. Mason at 8 O'clock. Letter from Architect and building Supt. Honeywell was read in which he expressed his willingness to postpone the erection of the new building until such time as financial conditions would justify erection of same. After some discussion a motion was made by O. W. Mason that the erection of the new building be postponed until the conclusion of the War, or until such time as in the judgment of the Building Committee conditions would justify a resumption of the building operation.

This was seconded by Mrs Long - Motion carried - Ayes 2, No votes.

Rev. F. C. Bible made a motion that we proceed to the collection of all pledges as far as possible and that the money be invested in Liberty Bonds so that we will have the money guaranteed and ready to proceed with the construction of the building when all things were ready - It was also included

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in the motion that for those who could not raise the money that they give a note drawing the same rate of interest as the Liberty Bonds - Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved and carried to have the Sec. to write up a statement in regard to the delay of construction of the Church and to have same printed in New Richmond Record -

Also he was directed to invite Bro. Cawble to come to New Richmond as soon as possible and help us dedicate a service flag, and also to sell some Liberty Bonds on the same occasion.

The Bill of Fred Bible for a Record Book for \$1.60 was ordered paid. Also the bill of O. W. Mason for 100 lbs "I" Beans \$12.98

Call Meeting, Tue. evening, Sept. 23rd, '19, O. W. Mason presiding: The resignation of J. P. Wright as minister was formally accepted. The hiring of Bro. Grisso was not accented to, after his having preached once. Sufficient subscriptions were received at this meeting to pay the Niedrick note at the New Richmond Bank amounting to \$100 plus the interest for more than a year. Meeting adjourned for one week, until Tue. ev., Sept. 30, whereupon motions were carried to call Bro. Riley upon the recommendation of Bro. Kauble. Bro. Riley preached twice after which the church made him an offer which he accepted, his pastorate introductory sermon being preached on Sun. morning, Nov. 9, '19.

Another call meeting for after S. S. on Sun., Oct. 19, '19 was made, W. D. Lane presiding, whereupon by a unanimous vote of those present, Dennis Stuckey was made a deacon to serve indefinitely. Mrs. Geo. Blough was also given to the first church in Crawfordville by letter.

Call meeting of the board, Jan. 9, 1920, O. W. Mason presiding, at H. D. Long's residence. H. D. Long, Treas., made report, considered the best for several years. Moved by Davisson sec. by Hunt that Treas. pay for room. Furnace-carried. Treas. instructed to furnish pastor, Riley with information by which to frame circular letter to help in conducting the every-member canvass—field was divided and men selected to make the drive. Bertha McCall requested her letter at this time, sent to Wolcott, Ind.

## CHURCH RECORD.

This Annual meeting of the Church membership, Oct. 4, 1920, was not largely attended. A. D. Long, presided, Mexie Turvey leading in prayer. Treas. report by A. D. Long; Ladies Aid report by Mrs. Devault; and the building committee report were all satisfactory. The balloting resulted in not retaining the pastor for the coming year. Mr. Long was entrusted to communicate with Bro. Davis about holding a meeting. Carried that the trustees hire a new janitor. Lane, Clerk.

Annual meeting Oct. 3, 1921. Eld. A. D. Long presided, opening with prayer by Miss Turvey. Motion was carried to retain W. D. Lane as clerk and A. D. Long as Treas for the coming year. Motion was carried that the chairman appoint a committee to investigate for a new man for the pastorate; committee—M. L. Davisson, F. L. Hunt, Jas Devault. Balloting resulted in not retaining present pastor for the coming year; left in hands of church board. Reading of some of the dedicatory instructions closed this meeting. W. D. Lane, Clerk.

Call meeting of the board, Oct. 6, 1921, at old church. Board selected M. L. Davisson for Elder, also as Deacons, Forrest Hays, John Singleton, and reassuming Earl Hays and John D. Patton, who had not been serving on account of absence.

Call meeting of the board, Oct. 10, 1921, at Long's store to make preparations for dedication of new church.

Call meeting of the officinary board, Dec. 1921 to effect the engagement of Prof. Chas. E. Cook of Wagnertown, Ind., to the pastorate, commencing Jan. 1st, 1922.

Call meeting of the board (date unknown) where-upon date of the annual congregational meeting was changed from first Monday in Oct. to month of June, July '22, being the beginning of the Brotherhoods business year.

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First Annual meeting of the church membership took the form of an all day meeting on a Lord's Day with a basket dinner, in the basement, on a beautiful June day, 1922. Bro. Cook as pastor, and his family were with us. The every member canvass was the all-important issue at this meeting.

May 16, 1923, official board met in call meeting on account of looking for a pastor, at which time Bro. Cook's resignation was accepted. Being behind on finance board decided not to hurry to get going another.

May 30, 1923, board met in call meeting, principally to straighten out system of finance. Moved by Davisson and sec. by Bible that church install rack system of keeping envelopes when each member may go and determine at once his financial standing with the church. Moved by Bible and sec. by Davisson that Treas. H. D. Long start bank account for Christian Church General Fund at Corn Exchange State Bank, New Richmond, Ind. and that all bills of church be paid by check upon this fund. Moved by Davisson sec. by Devault that at the annual meeting to be in June there be a financial sec. elected at the same time of the election of the other church officials. Moved by Long sec. by Bible that from time to time Davisson explain to the membership the features of the rack system of preserving the envelopes. Moved by Davisson sec. by Bible that board collect what can be collected and borrow remainder to pay Bro. Cook, and also notify concerning acceptance of resignation. Moved by Davisson sec. by Way that clerk ask Thomas of Crawfordsville to come for one week and preach, and do any baptizing that remained to be done.

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Second annual meeting of the church membership <sup>since dedication of new building</sup> took Lord's Day evening after preaching service June 24, 1923, a goodly number present including the pastor and his family. (See motion by Mrs. Davisson) No minutes were read as no business was conducted aside from the every member sawass. Moved by Davisson sec. by Hunt that all of the church's officers be retained, and in addition to those whose names are elsewhere on record the following are duly elected respectively: Dennis Stucky to serve indefinitely as elder; Emmitt Horn, Henry Thompson, Frank Oliver, and Arlie O. Patton to serve indefinitely as deacons, and Emmitt Horn as deacon to serve as financial secretary. Moved by Mrs. M. L. Davisson sec. by J. D. Patton that church retain Bro. Cook as long as he can preach for us; carried. General consent to continue furnishing C. Review with church's announcements. Moved by Bro. Cook sec. by Stucky that chair appoint Sister Herrick as church's correspondent for the N.R. Record using her class as assistants for that purpose. Chairman also named June 25 in evening to make preparations for every member sawass. A. D. Long, Chairman, W. D. Lane, clerk. At a call meeting a little later motion was made by Long and sec. by Lane that Fredrick E. Bible be formally elected chairman of board for remainder of 1923 and first half of 1924.

On Oct. 1st, 1923 "Board" met in call meeting in living room of church called to order by chairman, Fredrick E. Bible. Bill for 2 brooms (\$2<sup>30</sup>) presented by A. D. Long; approved by board and ordered paid. Decision was made after brief discussion to have "Board of Education" consisting of 5 members. The following were elected subject to approval of the Church: Mrs. Fern Davisson, Chairman; Mrs. Herrick, A. D. Long, W. D. Lane, & Ches. A. Patton. A motion was then carried to begin a meeting Sun. Oct. 13; whereupon it was also carried to have M. L. Davisson inform Bro. Leonard of this move and to have him come Sun. A. M. Oct. 6 as he was just commencing his

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pastorate at this church at this time. A motion was carried to put in two tons of coal, Fred E. Bible being chosen to look after same. F. E. Bible chairman, A. D. Long, Sec. pro tem.

The third annual all-day meeting and last business session for the year was held at the church on the last Lord's Day in June (June 29, 1924). Dinner was served in the basement. The day was beautiful, and the attendance was just average. The pastor (Bro. Leonard) was present and preached both morning and evening. The business session began in the afternoon in the church parlor. Problems of finance were discussed at some length followed by the Treasurer's report which showed that the pledges had not all been paid, hence some indebtedness. The self-accounting or book and envelope system was then discussed at some length after having laid on the table for something like a year. Eventually a motion was carried to put this system into action as a convenient means of bolstering the finance problem. At this juncture the every-family canvass started. Then it was carried by a general consent that Bro. Leonard preach for us second Sunday in July instead of the first on account of Dedication of the church at Pittsburg. It was then moved by Bro. Horn, and carried, that the remainder of the session be congregational to facilitate in signing of the pledges, the election of officers and so forth. Here Bro. Leonard made fine remarks on methods of financing the church. A collection was then taken to raise if possible \$10.00 to send to the church at Crawfordsville to help defray expenses of the annual fellowship meeting to be held there in July. In the election of officers Arthur D. Long was re-elected treasurer, W. D. Lane re-elected clerk, and Fred L. Hunt was elected financial sec. in place of Emmit Horn who retired. Edna R. Lane was re-elected as church pianist. This night the Y. M. C. A. chorus

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is to sing for us. It was moved and carried that giving them supper and entertaining them be turned over to the "Booster Club."

On July 6, 1924, the board of the church, after Sunday School, met as the result of a call by the chairman F. E. Bible, whereupon Bro. Bible was returned to the chairmanship by a unanimous vote. The primary import of the meeting was to arrange the completion of the canvass. It was finally agreed that a circular letter be sent to every uncanvassed member together with his self-accounting book and envelope explaining the church's business plans, needs of finance, and also the need of the devotion of its members. Long, Davison, and Lane were appointed to prepare this letter. It was further agreed to personally visit every one who failed to return his envelope. At the close of this session it was agreed to accept the resignation of F. L. Hunt as financial secretary in the favor of Bro. Frank Oliver.

The official board of the church met on Fri. evening Oct. 10th, 1924 in a call meeting by the chairman, F. E. Bible who also presided. Four canvassing teams of three members each were organized to complete the every-member canvass that was left unfinished on the Lord's Day of June 29th, - canvass to be made on afternoon of Oct. 12, 1924. A motion was carried to have clerk to appoint two members of the board to confer with the church treas. in auditing his books, and also to confer with the treas. of the "building fund" in auditing his books. The clerk appointed M. L. Davison and F. L. Hunt. Bible, Devault, and Horn raised the question of putting in the winter's coal direct from the mine at Kingman if others who could not haul would furnish money to buy it. Adjournment.

Board met in another call meeting Tue. eve. Oct. 21, 1924, the chairman presiding. Seven members were present. Canvassing teams, or representatives, made their reports. Moved by Davison sec. by Otucky that Church treas., A. D. Long, pay the balance due on the



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salaries of Carl and Forrest Waze to the Treas. of the "building fund," these salaries as pay for services as janitor paying their pledges in full to this fund. Carried. This motion also included that the treasurer also pay the present janitor, A. D. Long, to the limit of his funds on hand. It was also carried that the matter of the program's speakers be taken up with the pastor, G. F. Leonard, whether or not Bro. Burkhart could be secured for the event of Nov. 16th, and M. L. Davisson was appointed to attend to this matter. It was also carried that efforts be made to secure the services of the Lee Davis orchestra, Miss Mayome Patton being appointed to take charge of the musical end of the program. The dinner part of the program was placed in charge of the "ladies aid." It was also carried that the chairman appoint four members to assist clerk in preparing notices of the third annual installment of the pledges to the church building fund being due, and sending them to all who owe this fund together with an invitation to attend the third anniversary of the dedication of the new building. Bros. Stucky, Wagoner, Hunt, and Devault were named. A motion was carried that the chairman, J. E. Bible, place the coal proposition before the Sun. S. <sup>Oct. 26th</sup> Adjournment.

After the preaching service on Nov. 16, '34, official board assembled in basement to discuss question of relieving Sister Mary Long as security on note given for fund to pay the churches new building expenses. It was agreed to send Bros. O. W. Mason and J. E. Bible to make necessary investigation, arrangement etc with Frankfort Peoples Life Insurance Co. who carries the loan. This committee reported, later, favorably for Mrs. Long. Sister Long's compliment for this was the reduction of the debt \$600.00 for the "Ladies Aid." The obtaining of the signatures of all the remaining endorsers was necessary for her legal release.
